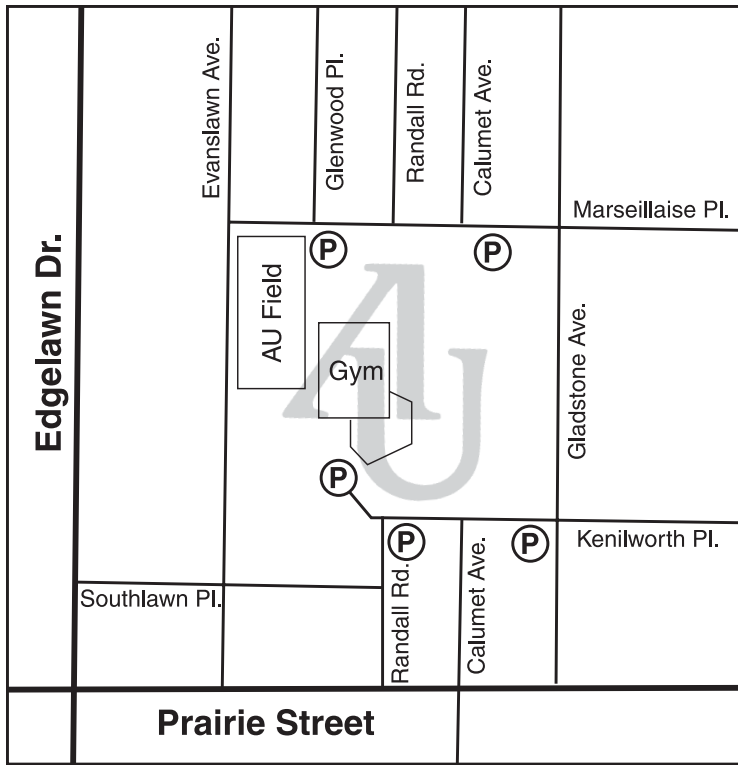
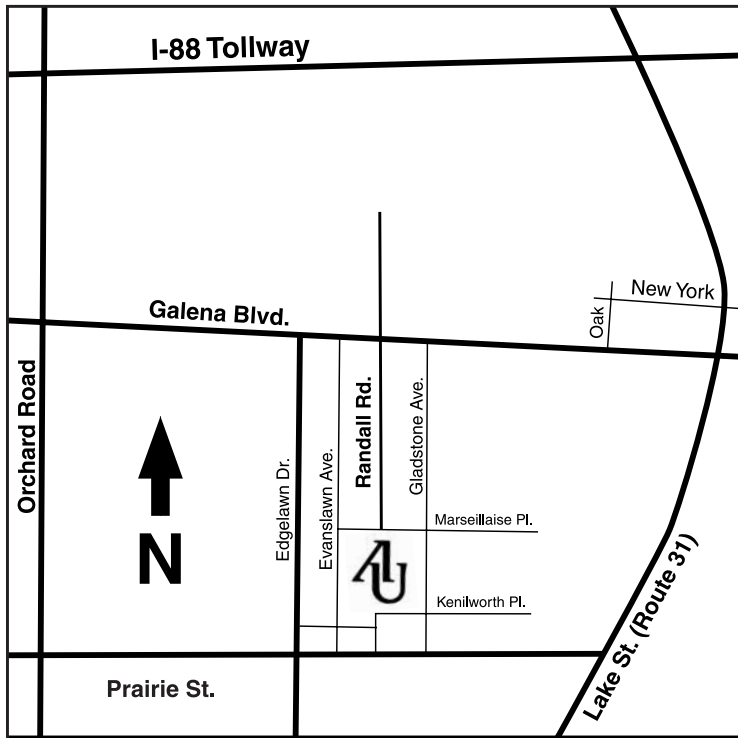

Meet the Head Coach



JAMES KLUCKHOHN
Head Coach
Second Season

James Kluckhohn is in his second season as the Head Coach of Aurora University's cross country and track and field programs. Kluckhohn pioneered these newest additions to AU's intercollegiate offerings.

Kluckhohn came to the Spartans from North Park University in Chicago where he was the Head Cross Country and Assistant Track and Field Coach. Prior to his three-year tenure at North Park, Kluckhohn was the Interim Head Track and Field Coach at Texas Lutheran University, a NCAA Division III institution in Seguin, TX. Kluckhohn was an assistant for three years in cross country and two years in track prior to becoming Interim Track and Field Coach. He also served as a cross country assistant at University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, where he was a part of a national championship in 1996.

Kluckhohn is no stranger to starting a program from the ground up. While at Texas Lutheran University, Kluckhohn helped to pioneer both the women's cross country and track and field programs. Overall, the team finished second in the American Southwest Conference in their first season.

As a student-athlete, Kluckhohn ran for the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse cross country and track team. The seven-time University of Wisconsin-La Crosse scholar athlete was named cross country team captain in 1993. Kluckhohn received his bachelor's in physical education from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, a master's in human performance from University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse, and his C.S.C.S. (Strength and Conditioning) certification. He is a member of the United States Track Coaches Association and National Strength and Conditioning Association.

He is married to Kari and has one son, Jacob.

Joel Williams is in his second season as Assistant Coach for the Aurora University Track and Field program. He graduated from North Central College in 1999 with a bachelor of arts degree in physical education. At North Central

His team also won the NCAA Division III National Championship. He formerly coached at Elmhurst College and Kent State University. Williams will work with the sprinters, hurdlers, and jumpers. Rick Hopf joins the Aurora University track and field staff following an excellent collegiate career at Lebanon Valley College, 1996-1998 and Case Western Reserve University, 2000. He earned All-American honors in the high jump in

1998 for Lebanon Valley College and concluded his career at Case Western Reserve University in 2000 having earned three conference titles and being named Co-Captain of his team. He still holds the Lebanon Valley record in the high jump at 6'9". Hopf earned his bachelor's in chemistry at Lebanon Valley 1999 and bachelor's in chemical engineering 2000. He is a member of the United States Track Coaches Association and currently resides in Lombard, IL.

2005 Men's Prospectus



The 2005 men's track and field team has big expectations this spring, which marks the second year for the men's track and field team at Aurora University. Head Coach **James Kluckhohn** believes this year's team is ready to make a name for itself.

Top returners include sophomore captain **Austin Deer**, who will be competing in the 400m hurdles, high jump, "javelin and decathlon; and sophomore **Aaron Smith** in the 400m dash, 800m dash, and javelin. The Spartans are also expecting a lot this year from its new recruits. "We have a lot of newcomers who should make a huge impact right away for us," Kluckhohn said in reference to the nine newcomers joining the team who were state qualifiers in high school. Newcomers include **Nick Aloisio**, **Scott Anderson**, and **David Mathew**, who will add depth to the Spartans' relay and short distance sprint teams. **Pierre Nealon**, **John Oakley**, **Matt Waite**, and **Jared Wells** are among those

looking to make an impact in the jumps (long, triple, and high). Rounding out the newcomers is **Travis Quigley**, who will be competing in the hurdles for the Spartans.

Kluckhohn is looking to build a very successful, nationally recognized track and field program at Aurora University and hopes this year's team will begin the process. "We are much stronger across the board in all areas of our team," commented Kluckhohn. Areas of strength include the long, triple, and high jump, and also the long sprints.

The Spartans are also looking to a number of freshmen to compete on the national level: Oakley in the high jump, Nealon in the triple jump, and Wells in the long jump.

"We should be one of the top two teams in our conference," stated Kluckhohn.

"Our squad has definitely improved in volume and quality, and it is a very good group. We are looking for good things from this team," he added.

April 15, 2003

January 30, 2004

The Spartan men do not score in the first indoor competition at the Carthage College Invitational.

March 27, 2004

The Spartan men compete in the first outdoor competition at the Concordia University (IL) Cougar Invitational. AU has its first track and field event champions as Austin Deer wins in 400m hurdles (1:02.74) and high jump (5'6"), and Aaron Smith wins the 400m dash (52.93).

Director of Athletics

Mark Walsh was named Director of Athletics in 1998. Previously, Walsh was AU's Head Baseball Coach from 1992-2002 and an assistant coach from 1987-1992. Walsh led the Spartans to nine NIIC Conference Championships and nine NCAA Tournament appearances while posting a 320-85 (.790) won-lost record in 10 seasons. Walsh also served as an assistant football coach at AU from 1986-1996 and was part of the coaching staff that reinstated football after it had been dropped in 1952. Walsh earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Aurora University.

This Is Aurora University



Eckhart Hall

Aurora University traces its origins to the 1893 founding of a seminary in the small town of Mendota, IL. Though established initially to prepare graduates for ministry, the institution soon adopted a broader mission and moved to a new campus on the western edge of the nearby community of Aurora. With this change came a different name and a growing enrollment. In 1985, the institution was rechristened Aurora University.

In 1992, the Aurora and George Williams College traditions blended when the two institutions entered into the affiliation agreement that paved the way for a merger eight years later.

Today Aurora University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association to award degrees at the baccalaureate, master's and doctoral levels. The institution enrolls approximately 4,000 degree-seeking students a year on its Illinois and Wisconsin campuses. AU offers its undergraduates a wide range of on- and off-campus learning experiences. Students participate in more than 40 musical, literary, religious, social, and service organizations and play active roles in campus governance. The university also fields 18 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic teams. The Spartans boast a winning tradition with 27 conference titles in recent years and 18 regular appearances in national tournaments.

The Alumni Hall of Physical Education features a racquetball court, climbing wall, complete locker-room facilities, training room, weight room, aerobic-activities room, classroom, and coaches' offices.

At AU, we believe that the educational needs of students are served best through the formation of strategic partnerships with institutions of like vision, mission, and values. Such collaborations also enhance the well being of the communities around our campus. For example, our innovative partnership with the West Aurora School District is recognized nationally as a model for educational reform. AU recently broke ground for the \$13 million facility that will house this growing collaboration and the students and faculty it nurtures. Our George Williams Campus at Lake Geneva, WI, is also the scene for important collaborative efforts. Last year, the residential, conference, and academic facility, developed in partnership with Children's Oncology Services Inc., opened. In the years ahead, the new building will serve as the home to the *One Step At A Time* Camp for children with cancer and the university's rapidly growing academic program.

Aurora University is located in west Aurora, within an hour's drive of Chicago and at the western end of the Illinois Research and Development Corridor. It is accessible via Interstate 88 at the Orchard Road exit.
