With the public's attention on our southern border at a contemporary high, join us for an exciting travel-study course focused on U.S.-Mexico relations.

Immerse yourself in U.S.-Mexico relations by traveling to San Diego, CA, and experience Mexico's cultural influence on the U.S. and learn about U.S. immigration and economic policies. Work alongside a non-profit whose mission focuses on the humanitarian needs of immigrants to the U.S. And, through a day trip to the San Diego Zoo, gain exposure to U.S. agricultural and environmental policy.

In the classroom, you will learn about community-based research methods, foundational concepts in the study of international relations, the history of U.S.-Mexican relations, and some of the current economic and public policies that define interactions between the two countries.

This course will be particularly exciting for students interested in careers in business, nonprofits, government, or international relations.
