

HLS2880 Travel Medicine and Public Health: Exploring Global Health | 4 credit hours

This course explores the intersection of travel and health, supplemented by a hands-on experience in Washington, D.C. Students will focus on the principles and practices of travel medicine and public health, and learn about various health risks associated with travel, including infectious diseases, environmental factors, and cultural considerations. Through case studies and discussions, students will develop the knowledge and skills necessary to assess, prevent, and manage health issues encountered during travel.
