

ECN3880 The Economics of Brexit: Policy, Labor, and Trade 4 credit hours

Dive into the fascinating world of international trade and policy by looking at one of today's most complex relationships: The United Kingdom and the European Union. We'll start with the post-World War II era to see how the EU took shape, then explore how history, politics, and economics all collide in real-world issues.

Using economic models, we'll unpack the trade implications of Brexit and examine major global topics like labor mobility, the COVID-19 pandemic, and environmental protection. You'll gain a clearer understanding of how trade works and why it can spark so much debate in today's world.

Students will share travel and select itinerary items with fellow AU students in the PSC2880 Brexit: Politics and Populism in the U.S. and UK course. This shared experience will give you an opportunity to explore Ireland together and make new connections while abroad.
