Theatre Scholarship Commitment

2024-2025 Academic Year

In granting you a scholarship in theatre, the Aurora University Theatre Faculty has placed their confidence in your dedication to our Theatre Department. Your scholarship award can be maintained by meeting the following criteria:

Participation in Mainstage Productions

Scholarship recipients are required to actively participate in at least two departmental mainstage productions during the academic year.

- If you are a performer, you must audition for all theatre department productions and accept any role offered to you. While auditioning is mandatory, please be advised that casting is not guaranteed, as all roles are awarded based on merit and the artistic vision of the director. In the event you are not cast, your participation is still essential.
- If you are not cast in a production or if you are primarily a technical staff member, you are expected to contribute in other capacities. This may include working on technical crews (set construction, lighting, sound, costumes, etc.), serving as a stage manager, or assisting with publicity and promotions, depending on the department's needs for each production. While we will consider your preferences for assignments, final decisions will be made by the faculty in accordance with production requirements, and your full cooperation is expected.

Academic Requirements

You must complete two theatre courses each academic year, achieving a grade of B or higher in each. First-year students are typically encouraged to enroll in foundational courses such as Introduction to Theatre, Acting I, or Stagecraft I. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher must be maintained to remain eligible for the scholarship.

Students will be evaluated by the theatre faculty each semester to review academic progress and scholarship status based upon the above criteria. It is the student's responsibility to fulfill all scholarship obligations and maintain open communication with the faculty regarding their commitments. The student will be notified if they are in danger of not meeting scholarship commitments, with enough time to correct behavior. A student who does not remedy the deficiencies will not be awarded the scholarship for subsequent semesters.

We look forward to your continued contributions to the Aurora University Theatre Department and your growth as both an artist and a scholar.

Theatre Scholarship Audition/ Interview

- Schedule an audition/ interview online at aurora.edu/theatrescholarship.
- Award amounts range from \$500 to \$5,000.
- Open to all students regardless of major or minor.
- Performers, designers, and technicians can all apply.

What you will need for your audition

- **Performers** prepare a short monologue (one to two minutes) of your choosing; please no improvisations "on the spot." After your prepared presentation, there will be an informal interview with faculty members.
- **Designers/ Backstage**, bring a portfolio of work you have done. Examples of portfolio work include sketches, photographs of work, prompt books, etc. If you do not have a portfolio, we encourage you to bring what you do have available, and we will discuss your experiences as part of the interview process. After your prepared presentation, there will be an informal interview with faculty members.
- **Letter of recommendation:** Applicants must submit a letter of recommendation from one person who knows them as a theatre artist commenting upon character, demonstrated work ethic, team participation and ability of the applicant. This may be submitted via email or at the time of your audition.

Helpful information:

- Auditions/interviews will last approximately fifteen minutes.
- Please dress professionally for your audition.
- Auditions/Interviews are held in Black Box Theatre, Stephens 119, (349 S. Gladstone Ave.) between 1:00-4:00 p.m.

Please make every effort to audition on the above date. We understand, however, that schedules can be difficult. Alternate audition dates are available and can be arranged with three weeks advanced notice.
