

### Baseball: The Tradition Continues

The Aurora University baseball team enters its second season under the leadership of Head Coach Shaun Neitzel, who enters his seventh season with the baseball program.

During Neitzel's tenure with the program as both head coach and as an assistant coach, AU has posted a sparkling 228-70-3 overall record.

The Spartans finished 25-16-2 in 2003, and advanced to the championship game of the NIIC Conference Baseball Tournament. The Spartans lost only two starting position players from last year's team that finished third in the nation in batting

with a .363 average, and led the country in doubles per game at 2.74 (118 total). They also return an experienced pitching staff, losing only one pitcher who pitched significant innings during the 2003 campaign.

With the addition of some quality freshmen, the Spartans are poised for a run at both the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference title, as well as a berth in the NCAA Division III playoffs. The Spartan's tradition in baseball continues as they have won 18 of the past 20 NIIC titles, and have received 14 NCAA Tournament bids since 1987, including four NCAA Division III World Series appearances. The Spartans finished second in the 1990 World Series and fourth in 1998.

#### The Infield

The 2004 Spartans are built around a deep and talented infield, led by junior captains first baseman Brian Chelgren (Thornwood HS) and third baseman Brian Brandenburg (Batavia HS). Chelgren, a 2002 Second-Team All-Region and All-Conference performer, missed most of the 2003 season due to injury. Brandenburg, a three-year starter for the Spartans at third base, was named NIIC Honorable Mention All-Conference as a sophomore when he hit .387 with 5 HRs, 42 RBIs, and an .866 fielding percentage.

Providing quality depth at first base will be sophomore Nick Weber (West Aurora HS), who filled in for Chelgren midway through the 2003 campaign and hit .336 with 2 HRs, 36 RBIs, and a .996 fielding percentage. Competing for playing time at second base will be junior transfer Kevin Morris (College of DuPage); senior J.R. Veliz (Waubonsee CC), who returns after taking a year off; and sophomore Ryan Brooks (Plainfield HS).

Manning the shortstop position will be sophomore Aaron Thor (Guilford HS). As a freshman, Thor hit .391 with 5 HRs, 36 RBIs, and 13 doubles. Backing up Thor at shortstop will be seniors Steve Schrader (Glenbard East HS) and Dan Gregory (Elgin CC).

Providing quality depth behind Brandenburg at third base will be freshman Ryan Losacco (Bartlett HS) and senior Chris McVey (Providence HS).

Others vying for action in the infield will be sophomore first baseman Chad Turrell (Bradley Bourbonnais HS), freshman second baseman John Paul Baunach (Hinckley-Big Rock HS), and freshman second baseman Jason Losciale (Oswego HS).

"Aaron Thor and Brian Brandenburg will pair up on the left side to be a solid tandem at shortstop and third base. Getting Brian Chelgren back will be a huge lift for us both offensively and defensively, while Nick Weber played well in his absence last year. One of the question marks will be at second base. All three contenders (Veliz, Morris, and Brooks) bring something different to the table. It will be interesting to see how that develops throughout the season," commented Neitzel.

#### The Outfield

The 2004 Spartans will look to their outfield to provide strength and leadership. Senior captain Jason Smith (Richards HS) returns following a 2003 campaign in which he was named First-Team All-Central Region and NIIC All-Conference. On the year, Smith hit .421 with 6 triples, 13 doubles, and 72 hits. Junior Jav Lavender (Oswego HS) returns after being named Second Team All-Central Region and NIIC All-Conference. Lavender hit .375, with 5 HRs, 5 triples, 15 doubles, and a team-high 51 RBIs.

Sophomore John Hopkins (Lockport HS) looks to roam centerfield for the Spartans, following his freshman year when he hit .363 and was 10-of-12 in stolen bases. Junior

Blake Whitney (Richards HS) and freshman Jay Zimmerman (Plainfield HS) will add quality depth in the outfield and off the bench as pinch hitters.

Sophomores Steve Ogan (Dixon HS) and Nick Haines (North Muskegon HS) and freshman Jeff Brummel will compete for playing time in the outfield as well.

"Jason Smith and John
Hopkins are the catalyst of our
team at the top of our lineup.
Jay Lavender will be a middle-ofthe-order guy who should drive
in a bunch of runs. All three
players are excellent defenders
with above-average arms. Blake
Whitney and Jay Zimmerman
are both right behind and capable
of starting for us. Our outfield
depth is definitely one of our
strengths," said Neitzel.

#### Behind the Plate

The catching position will be placed in the hands of a young but experienced returning sophomore starter, Chris Forbes (Glenbard East HS), who hit .358 with 1 HR and 27 RBIs. Providing quality catching depth and battling for playing time will be four freshmen: Zach DeGrush (Morris HS), Russell Summers (Springfield HS), Mike Plachetka (Yorkville HS), and Mike Novak (Shepard HS).

Said Neitzel, "Our catching core has been the biggest upgrade from a year ago. We brought in four quality freshmen who give us much-needed depth behind the plate."

#### On the Hill

AU's commitment to excellence will begin once again on the mound. The 2004 pitching staff is deep and talented from top to bottom. Returning to lead the Spartan staff will be senior captain Rob Fontana (3-1, 5.43, 44 Ks, Jacobs HS), senior Jeff Salzmann (4-0, 4.44, 38 Ks, Burlington Central HS), and senior Chris Olson (2-2, 6.41, 22 Ks, Lake Park HS). Providing experience and quality depth for the Spartans will be sophomore Adam Hutten (6-1, 2.86, 45 Ks, Lockport HS) and junior George Creviston (3-2, 6.02, 41 Ks, Guilford HS).

Other returners and newcomers looking for innings will be juniors Mike Gunter (Yorkville HS) and Anthony Ermitage (St. Joseph HS); sophomore Spencer Gallien (Maine West HS); and freshmen Joel Rodriquez (Lyons Township HS), Ryan Baird (Streamwood HS), Ryan Fair (Plainfield HS), Jonathan Turek (Glenbard East HS), Mike Bozek (Lyons Township HS), Ryan Koper (Bartlett HS), and Dan Ermitage (St. Joseph HS).



#### Softball:

#### A New Era

The Aurora University softball team has three position players and three pitchers returning from the 21-18-1 campaign in 2003. The Spartans finished 11-1 in the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference and regular season conference champions, and second in the post-season tournament.

Head Coach Mike McKenzie enters his first season at the helm of the Spartan softball program. "I am excited about the returning players, as well as some of the talented transfers and freshmen we have," McKenzie stated.



#### Top Returnees

Leading the top returnees are senior first baseman Haley Zimmerman and sophomore catchers Melissa Rousse and Tara Zito. Zimmerman is a two-year starter who hit .319 for last year's Spartans and was named NIIC All-Conference. Rousse was named 2003 Great Lakes Third Team All-Region, NIIC All-Conference, and led the team with a .395 batting average with 15 doubles and 31 RBI. Zito is a very versatile player who hit .282 and led the team in runs scored with 26.

Other returnees who will compete for playing time are junior Nikki Petersohn (IF), sophomore Zuri Quiles (IF/OF), and sophomore Megan Dhom

The Spartan's top returning pitcher, sophomore Elizabeth Parker, went 9-5 with 100 innings pitched in 2003 and was named NIIC All-Conference. Senior Tiffany Paddock and sophomore Brandy Ward return following 2003 campaigns in which Paddock went 2-5 with 56 innings pitched, and Ward went 6-6 with 55 innings pitched. "Our main goals are to drastically lower our team earned run average as a pitching staff from last season (3.82) and defensively improve on our errors (86)," said McKenzie.

#### **Key Additions**

The addition of three key transfers will also add quality experience to the 2004 Spartans. Taylor Petersen (P/3B), Beth Nyhlen (SS/2B), and Kristy Vetter (OF/2B) all come into the Spartan program after playing two years of college softball in quality programs.

Petersen comes to the Spartans after spending the last two seasons at Syracuse University where she was in the top five of numerous pitching records. Nyhlen and Vetter come in after spending the last two seasons at College of DuPage where they gained national tournament experience.

"Taylor has pitched some key innings at a high-level Division I program and also adds an excellent bat to the line-up. Beth and Kristy were both key players on very good COD teams and add quality offense and defense to the team," said McKenzie.

The freshman class provides some excellent versatility for McKenzie. Jen Spoden, Nicole Collins, Caryssa Douglas, and Susan Reinheimer all have the ability to play and compete at several positions in both the infield and the outfield.

McKenzie added, "Spoden, Collins, Douglas, and Reinheimer all having the ability to play several different positions, and will be key for us throughout the season."

#### The Schedule



The key will be how quickly our inexperienced players adapt to their roles. Our quality pitching depth will also be a huge factor to our success."

#### Men's Basketball: Conference Champions

The Aurora University men's basketball team finished the 2003-2004 season 19-8, 10-2, and NIIC regular season conference champions. This season was the first time the Spartans have won the NIIC crown since the 1997-1998 campaign. Over the past four seasons, the Spartans are a combined 41-4 at home.

James Lancaster improved his career record as the men's head coach at AU to 176-83. Overall at AU, Lancaster is 234-125. Lancaster was honored by his fellow NIIC coaches as the 2003-2004 NIIC Coach of the Year, his fourth time receiving such an honor.

Leading the charge for the Spartans was junior guard Adam McCoy (St. Teresa HS). On the season, McCoy, named NIIC All-Conference, led the team averaging 15.2 points per game and shot 37.6 percent from three-point range. Senior forward



Andre Meeks (East Aurora HS), named NIIC Honorable Mention All-Conference, averaged 11.7 points and 7.7 rebounds per contest. Other key contributors for the season include junior guard Drew Gronau (Streamwood HS), NIIC All-Conference, averaged 10.4 points and led the team with 3.5 assists per game, while Terrell Watkins (Proviso West HS), NIIC All-Conference, averaged 10.4 points and a teamhigh 7.8 rebounds per game.

The Spartan's season ended when conference rival Benedictine University upset them in the conference tournament championship game 74-70. The Spartans defeated Clarke College (70-65) in the semi-final matchup to advance to their second straight NIIC tournament championship game.


## Women's Basketball: NCAA Bound

The 2003-2004 Aurora University women's basketball team concluded the season with a record of 11-18, 7-5, finishing in third place in the NIIC regular season. For the second time in three years, the Spartans advanced to the NCAA Division III

Women's National Tournament. The Spartans defeated Eureka College (57-40) at home and both Rockford College (48-46) and Benedictine University (62-53) on the road to give them the conference tournament title and the automatic berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament.

The Spartans fell in the first round of the NCAA tournament 88-44 at DePauw University in Greencastle, IN. After starting the season 1-13, the Spartans turned it around, finishing 10-5 in their last 15 games.

Leading the way for the Spartans was freshman guard Beth Plucinski (Vernon Hills HS). Named NIIC All-Conference, she led the team averaging 12.6 points, 4.2 assists and, 1.66 steals per game. Senior forward Tina Brooks (Streamwood HS), also named NIIC All-Conference, had an impressive season for the Spartans. The senior captain helped the Spartan charge averaging 10.8 points, 5.4 rebounds, and 1.9 blocks a contest. Freshman forward Courtney Lillard (Danville HS), NIIC Honorable Mention All-Conference, averaged 6.4 points and a team high 5.9 rebounds a game for the Spartans coming off the bench.





#### Men's Track: Building Blocks

The spring of 2004 brings a new face to the Aurora University campus. Beginning its first season as a sanctioned sport under the direction of Head Coach James Kluckhohn, men's track looks to get a quick start out of the blocks.

In the early years of the program's development, the focus will be primarily on middle distance and sprint events with some emphasis on specific field events like shot put, discus, and long and triple jump. Each of the next couple years, the track and field events will incorporate more field events and develop better depth in the running events. "I want to see a balanced team develop across the running and field events in the next few years," said Kluckhohn.

Kluckhohn plans to build a successful, nationally recognized Division III track team with a strong foundation of athletes already on the AU campus.

Like their male counterparts, the women, in the early years of the programs development, will focus primarily on middle distance and sprint events with some emphasis on specific field events like shot put, discus, and long and triple jump.
