Meet the Head Coach



SHAUN NEITZEL Head Coach (Fifth Season)

Shaun Neitzel was named Head Baseball Coach at Aurora University in 2002, and has been coaching at the collegiate level for over a decade. Neitzel leads one of the most successful baseball

programs in the country, as the Spartans currently hold the tenth-best overall win total (493) since 1990. The 2006 Spartan squad won the Central Region and went on to a NCAA Division III World Series appearance. That team finished with a 34-14 overall record. His 2004 Spartans won the Central Region and finished tied for 3rd place in the NCAA Division III World Series. For their efforts that season, Neitzel was named 2004 American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Central Region Coach of the Year. Into 2006 Neitzel was honored with that award. Along with working several instructional camps and individual lessons annually, Neitzel is a member of the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA). Following the 2005 season, Neitzel was named Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference Baseball Coach of the Year.

During his tenure as an assistant with the Spartans, Neitzel served as a pitching coach, first base coach, administered AU's junior varsity program and coordinated recruiting. During that time, the Spartans compiled a record of 167-45 (.790), winning five conference championships, while making four regional and two national tournament trips. "Playing at the national level is a high priority for our program. Our committment every year is to recruit high quality student-athletes who will take pride in putting on that Spartan uniform," he said.

Neitzel has his roots in the Aurora area as a graduate of nearby Oswego High School, where he was All-Area in football and basketball and All-Conference in baseball for the Panthers. He also played baseball for Waubonsee Community College. While at WCC, he was twice the national co-leader for saves in a season. He set the school season and career records for saves and appearances while pitching for the Chiefs as well.

He also pitched for the nationally prominent William Penn College program, and upon finishing his collegiate playing career, he became an assistant coach for the Statesmen. As an assistant with the Statesmen, WPC was an NCAA tournament qualifier in 1995. He served as an infield coach and pitching coach through the 1996 season.

Neitzel earned his B.A. in sports administration while minoring in sales and marketing. He also currently serves as the Coordinator of Athletic Marketing and Promotions and Fall/Winter Game Operations Manager at AU. He received his Master of Science degree in recreation administration from Aurora University. He and his wife, Michelle, and daughters, Allison and Lily, reside in Montgomery, IL.

Meet the Assistant Coaches



ZACH FOX Assistant Coach (Fifth Season)

Zach Fox is in his fifth season as Assistant Coach in the Aurora University baseball program. Fox will serve as the infield/outfield coach,

work with the hitters and work with AU's junior varsity program.

Fox entered the AU baseball program as a freshman in 1996 and played four years with the Spartans. In his four years, he was part of a team that won four NIIC championships and made four trips to the NCAA regional, winning it twice. He also made two trips to the Division III World Series in Salem, VA. Fox was a two-time All-NIIC player and a two-time All-Central Region selection. Fox was captain in 2000 as well as the team's MVP. He also is in the Aurora University baseball record book in several individual and team categories.

Fox double majored at AU, earning a bachelor's degree in political science and psychology. He is a native of Silvis, IL, and a graduate of United Township High School in East Moline, IL, where he played baseball and basketball. Fox currently is the Conference and Rentals Coordinator at Aurora University.

He and his wife, Nicole, reside in Montgomery, IL.



BRIAN KIPLEY Assistant Coach (Fifth Season)

Brian Kipley is in his fifth season as Assistant Coach in the Aurora University baseball program. He will work with the pitching staff and AU's junior varsity program.

Kipley entered the AU baseball program as a freshman in 1998 and played four years with the Spartans. In those four years, he was part of four NIIC championship teams and made three trips to the NCAA regional.

Kipley earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 2002 from AU. He has been the Sports Information Director at AU since 2003. He is a native of Thornton, IL, and a graduate of Mount Carmel High School in Chicago.



JASON SMITH Assistant Coach (Second Season)

Jason Smith returns to the Aurora University coaching staff for his second season. This comes after Smith spent the summer coaching in the Central Illinois Collegiate

League (CICL). Smith served as an assistant to the Quincy Gems. Prior to his coaching time here at AU, Smith coached for one season at Manchester College.

Like the other assistants, coaching at AU brings Smith back to his playing days. Smith entered the AU baseball program as a freshman in 2001 and played four years with the Spartans. In those four years, he was part of two NIIC championship teams, and made two trips to the NCAA regional and one trip to the Division III World Series (2004). Smith was a three-time All-NIIC Player, a two-time All-Central Region selection, and a two-time captain.

Smith earned a bachelor's degree in English from Aurora University. He is a native of Chicago Ridge, IL, and a graduate of Richards High School. Smith currently is the Athletics Event/Equipment Manager at the university.

2007 Baseball Prospectus

After making an appearance at the 2006 NCAA Division III World Series, the 2007 Spartan baseball team aims to make another run at the elusive national championship. The 12th ranked team in the country going into the season, the Spartans have a good mix of youth and leadership to go along with their surplus of talent.

After winning the NIIC regular season championship a year ago, AU was eliminated in the conference tournament. Gaining an at-large invitation to the NCAA Regional Tournament, AU had the chip on its shoulder that was needed. The Spartans were the only team left standing at the end of the Regional, and it garnered them a trip to the Division III World Series. The Spartans were eliminated early on in the World Series, but finished the year with an impressive 34-14 record. AU is now ready to make amends with the 2007 campaign, and begin another run at the national title.

The 2007 Spartans look to continue their long tradition of being a national baseball powerhouse. AU has had 22 consecutive winning seasons, 20 20+ win seasons, has won the NIIC 20 out of the past 23 seasons and has appeared in the NCAA Regional in 17 out of the past 20 seasons. The 2007 team looks to be led by a senior class that has an impressive resume. Throughout their collegiate careers, this group of players has amassed a 96-42 overall record, which includes three consecutive appearances at the NCAA Regional Tournament, and two appearances at the NCAA Division III World Series.

Leading the pitching staff this year will be seniors Jonathan Turek and Ryan Fair. Turek (2.45 ERA, 5-0) was an All-Conference selection a year ago, and will make a transition from long reliever to starting pitcher this season. Fair (1.40 ERA, 1-0, 12 saves) completed a junior campaign which saw him lead the nation in saves. He was also named to the All-Central region (Third) Team. Juniors Kyle Mueller (6.44 ERA, 4-2) and Casey Friend (5.87 ERA, 1-2) will be starting pitchers who need to carry a bulk of the innings, while sophomores Chris Koudelka (6.00 ERA, 0-0), Dennis Vietoris (5.53 ERA, 2-1) and Brandon Thielk all appear to be fighting for starting rotation spots.

Freshman Steve Salazar (Glenbard West H.S.) will also have a chance to shine in the starting rotation, but may also need to take some innings from the bullpen. Joining him in the bullpen will be a good mix of experienced relievers which include: junior Adam Deckman (0-1, two appearances), and junior Lew Blaszczyk. Freshmen Ben Brooker (Hobart (IN) H.S.) and Matt Nellman (Griffith (IN) H.S.) will also be in the mix as relievers.

The Spartan infield will miss the experience of former four-year starter, and First Team All-American Aaron Thor, but will build a new foundation with youth and experience. Senior third-baseman Ryan Losacco is the lone returnee for the Spartans, and he will work to improve on his stellar 2006 season. In 2006, Losacco hit .344 with five home runs and 44 RBIs. He was also named to the Central Region All-Tournament Team. Joining Losacco will be sophomores Josh Damore (.143, 12 runs) at shortstop and Martin Diaz (.273, one home run) at first base. Both saw limited playing time last year. Second base is open for competition as sophomore Dave Warner (.189, seven hits) and Luke Krippel, along with freshman Steve Brauer (Streamwood H.S.), will all be in the mix for playing time. Sophomore Kevin Fitzgerald (.200, one hit) hopes to play into the infield mix as he will be needed to back up Losacco, give Diaz days off at first base, and possibly designated hitter. Sophomore Ben Oliver, freshman Nolan Eddy (Harlem H.S.), freshman Mike Wons (Waubonsie Valley H.S.), and freshman Tim Garvin (Providence H.S.), freshman Matt Anklam (Glenbard North H.S.) and freshman Zach Morris (California Lutheran H.S.) will be pushing the rest of the infielders for playing time.

The outfielders will be led by two-time senior All-Conference selection Jay Zimmerman (.324, five home runs, 36 RBIs) in left field. Zimmerman was also named to the All-Central Region Team in 2005. Junior Joe Infantino(.205, eight hits) looks to have a hold on right-field, while junior Peter Oliver (.250, eight hits) and freshman Tony Wellner (Minooka H.S.) will battle for the centerfield job. Freshmen Jimmy Bowers (Bishop Noll H.S.), Cody DeGrush (Morris H.S.) and Cliff Hempstead (Richards H.S.) will be competing for valuable back-up playing time.

The catchers will be a platoon scenario with senior Zach DeGrush (.260, 13 hits, two doubles) taking the bulk of the innings. Sophomore Ray Kosmicki (Schaumburg H.S.) looks to be the one splitting time with DeGrush, while freshman Kirk Williamson (Neuqua Valley H.S.), sophomore Sean Noggle, freshman Brandon Scheffler (Burlington Central H.S.) and freshman Kevin Doerr (Milwaukee Pius XI H.S.) will all be fighting for playing time.

The Spartans started their season in March in Phoenix, AZ. This season will be a test of their youth and experience, while proving that they deserve the national recognition they were given before encountering the Northern Athletics Conference schedule.

AU NCAA Post-Season History

AU BASEBALL: A WINNING TRADITION

Aurora University has established itself as a force to be reckoned with in NCAA Division III baseball. A look at AU's history of post-season tournament play supports this fact.

In 1987, the Spartans made their first-ever NCAA appearance in the Mideast Regional and emerged with a respectable 3-2 second-place finish including a victory over defending national champ Marietta College.

From 1989 to 2000, the Spartans had a string of 12 consecutive NCAA post-season bids. AU is the only Illinois team ever invited to that many Division III baseball playoffs consecutively (1990 second, 1992 seventh, 1998 fourth, 1999 seventh and 2004 third).

The campaign of **1992** marked AU's second D-III World Series trip. At the Central Region tournament in St. Louis, AU went 4-1 to head back to Battle Creek, but not without some hard work. The Spartans bounced back from a 22-1 loss to William Penn, and eventually avenged the lopsided defeat with two consecutive victories over WPC to take the regional crown.

AU appeared in the Central Region tourney in **1993** and **1994**. In 1993, after dropping the opening game to Upper Iowa, the Spartans worked their way back to the finals versus Carthage, losing 5-4. In 1994, AU lost both games versus Carthage and North Central.

It was Carthage-AU again in **1995** for the Central Region title in Kenosha, WI, with the host Redmen prevailing. AU defeated Upper Iowa and Carthage in its first two outings, but Carthage won a doubleheader to advance to the D-III series.

In 1996, AU knocked off Carthage in the first round, but dropped its next two games to bow out of the regionals with a third-place finish.

1997 saw the Spartans lose their opening game and face the must-win situation. AU won its next three games of the tourney (over Wartburg, MacMurray and Carthage) to force the winner-take-all championship game. However, Carthage eliminated AU, 15-10, in a 10-inning thriller in the title finale.

The 1998 post-season resulted in AU's thirdever appearance in the NCAA Division III national championship tournament. The Spartans advanced to the World Series by topping Carthage, before dumping North Central twice to sweep through the Central Region competition.

In 1999, the Spartans earned their fourth-ever appearance in the NCAA Division III national championship tournament. The Spartans defeated Augustana, Simpson and Carthage (twice) to sweep the regional championship in four games.

In **2000**, the Spartans appeared in their 12th consecutive NCAA Regional Tournament. The Spartans lost in the opening game to Wartburg, IA (7-8), and were defeated in game two by Carthage, WI (2-11).

In **2002**, the Spartans appeared in their 13th NCAA Regional Tournament in 14 seasons. The Spartans lost in the opening game to Monmouth, IL (0-4), and faced a must-win situation. AU won its next game against Wartburg, IA (10-2), but fell to Monmouth, IL in the following game (1-2).

In 2004, the Spartans appeared in their fifth NCAA Division III national championship tournament. The Spartans defeated Illinois Wesleyan, McMurry, Simpson and Carthage to sweep the regional championship in four games by a combined score of 58 to 24. Overall, Aurora University has a 39-31 record in NCAA post-season baseball championship play.

In **2005**, the Spartans appeared in their 16th NCAA Regional Tournament in 19 seasons. The Spartans lost the opening game to Ripon, WI (6-2) and were eliminated by Washington University, St. Louis (12-9).

In 2006, the Spartans appeared in their 17th NCAA Regional Tournament in 20 seasons. The Spartans won their opening game against Washington University, and then were defeated by Millsaps College. Facing elimination, the Spartans defeated Carthage College and the College of Mt. St. Joseph. This set up a rematch against Millsaps College on the final day of the Regional. The Spartans won both games to advance to the NCAA Division III World series.

At the national championships, the Spartans were defeated by Montclair State University on opening day, and were eliminated by UW-Stevens Point to finish their successful season.




Mark Walsh Director of Athletics

Mark Walsh was named Director of Athletics in 1998. Previously, Walsh was AU's Head Baseball Coach from 1992 to 2002 and Assistant Coach from 1987 to 1992. Walsh led the Spartans to nine NIIC championships and nine NCAA Tourna-

ment appearances while posting a 320-85 (.790) won-lost record in 10 seasons. Walsh also served as Assistant Football Coach at AU from 1986 to 1996 and was part of the coaching staff who reinstated football after it had been dropped in 1952. Walsh earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Aurora University.

This Is Aurora University

Aurora University traces its origins to the 1893 founding of a seminary in the small town of Mendota, IL. Though established initially to prepare graduates for ministry, the institution soon adopted a broader mission and moved to a new campus on the western edge of the nearby community of Aurora. With this change came a different name and a growing enrollment. In 1985, the institution was rechristened Aurora University.

In 1992, the Aurora and George Williams College traditions blended when the two institutions entered into the affiliation agreement that paved the way for a merger eight years later.

Today Aurora University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association to award degrees at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. The institution enrolls approximately 4,000 degree-seeking students a year on its Illinois and Wisconsin campuses.

The Aurora campus offers undergraduate and graduate programs through the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Education and the College of Professional Studies (including the Dunham School of Business, School of Nursing, School of Social Work and School of Health and Physical Education.) The graduate programs offer areas of specialization, leading to master's degrees in business administration, mathematics, recreation administration, teaching and social work, as well as a doctorate in education.

At AU, academic programs are enhanced through learning opportunities. The Dunham Scholars Program incorporates service learning and extracurricular activities into its business curriculum. The Honors Program offers students advanced coursework, innovative seminars and participation in special events. May Term is a three-week program offering opportunities to study abroad, research a science topic on campus or travel to Chicago to explore the city's culture.

AU offers its undergraduates a wide range of on- and off-campus learning experiences. Students participate in more than 60 musical, literary, religious, social and service organizations and play active roles in campus governance. The university also fields 18 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic teams. The Spartans boast a winning tradition with 49 conference titles in recent years and 27 regular appearances in national tournaments.

The Alumni Hall of Physical Education features a racquetball court, climbing wall, complete locker room facilities, training room, weight room, aerobic-activities room, classroom and coaches' offices.

Aurora University is located in west Aurora, within an hour's drive of Chicago and at the western end of the Illinois Research and Development Corridor. It is accessible via Interstate 88 at the Orchard Road exit.
