

### Meet the Head Coach



MIKE MCKENZIE Head Coach (Fourth Season)

Mike McKenzie will enter his fourth season as Head Softball Coach of the Aurora University softball program. McKenzie came to Aurora University from Marian College in Indianapolis, IN, where he served as Head Women's

Softball Coach, Assistant Men's Basketball Coach and Director of Intramurals. In his three seasons at AU, McKenzie's Spartans have a 107-28-1 record and have captured the Northern Illinois-Iowa Conference championship all three years.

The Spartans made trips to the 2005 and 2006 NCAA Division III Softball Tournament. He was named NIIC softball Coach of the Year following the 2005 and 2006 seasons. Over the previous six seasons before coming to AU, McKenzie posted a 171–80 record, including a 36–10 record and an NAIA national tournament appearance in 2003. He was named Mid-Central Conference Coach of the Year in the 1998 and 2002 seasons.

McKenzie began his coaching career as a basketball and baseball coach at Scecina Memorial High School in Indianapolis, IN, from 1986 to 1995. As an athlete, he played both basketball and baseball at Beech Grove High School in Indianapolis where he was named MVP of his varsity basketball team.

McKenzie continued his playing career at Marian College in Indianapolis. He was a three-year starter and captain of the men's basketball team. He received his B.S. in physical education from Marian College and his master's degree in kinesiology from Indiana University. He was named outstanding senior in physical education at Marian College in 1986.



LAURA OPIE Assistant Coach (Third Season)

Laura Opie enters her third season with the Spartan softball program as an assistant coach. Opie came to AU after one season as an assistant at Judson College (2004). She graduated from Judson College in 2001 with a degree in

Business Management.

As an athlete, Opie played both basketball and softball at Harvard High School and Judson College. At Judson, Opie was a four year starter in softball and was named to the NCCAA All-Region Team (as junior and senior) to the CCAC (Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference) All-Conference Team, CCAC All-Tournament Team, team captain and team MVP as a senior. At Harvard, she was a four-year starter in softball and was named to the Big Northern All-Conference Team and a team captain, as a junior and senior as well as named the team MVP as a senior. A two-sport athlete, Opie was named to the Big Northern All-Conference Team as well as a team captain as a senior in basketball.

### 2007 Softball Prospectus

The 2007 Aurora University softball team will, once again, have its eye on a conference championship and a NCAA Tournament birth. The Spartans are relying on 10 players who saw significant time last year and a good crop of newcomers as they prepare for playing in the newly formed Northern Athletics Conference.

The Spartans have good reason to be excited about this upcoming season, riding the momentum of a 38-11 season and a

NIIC conference championship.

Additionally, AU returns the core group of Spartans from second consecutive NCAA Division III regional appearance. AU went 2-2 at the Augustana College Regional. Five Spartans were named to the 2006 Northern Illinois-Iowa All-Conference Team. Senior Caryssa Douglas will lead AU this year as she works to improve on her .350 batting average and team-leading eight home runs from a year ago. Douglas was also named All-NIIC and Third Team All-Central Region. Also returning will be Brittany Butcher, AU's top pitcher for much of last season. Butcher, an All-NIIC selection, finished 2006 with a 17-5 record, which included a 2.59 ERA in 151.1 innings of work. Senior infielder Jen Spoden and senior catcher/outfielder Michelle Holtorf also hope to lead the Spartans in their final collegiate campaign. AU will also bring back some key juniors this year who aim to improve on their already impressive collegiate careers. Infielder Dana Cebular was an All-NIIC and Second Team All-Central region selection a year ago will make for a potent middle of the order punch when combined with Douglas. Fellow junior Jamie Mueller also looks to improve on her 2006 season which saw her hit .281 in 38 games.

The experience keeps on coming for AU as sophomore All-NIIC selections Nicole Capone and Abby Young return. Capone, the other returning member of AU's dominant 2006 pitching staff, will add to her 2006 totals which included going 19-6 with a 1.66 ERA. Young, who was also named to the Central Region Tournament Team, will provide a potent offensive punch from behind the plate. Her 2006 season was highlighted by a .349 average. Other sophomores who return with experience include outfielder Nikki Veen and infielder Beth Okrie. Transfer Julie Beenes also looks to provide some experience after already having played two seasons at Moraine

Valley C.C.

Coach McKenzie is also very excited about his freshman class. Pitchers Anna Snyder and Mary Pat Cummings look to take some of the load off of Capone and Butcher, while catcher Briana Martin, catcher/infielder Marissa Osness, catcher/infielder Abby Peters, outfielder/catcher Karisa Hansen, catcher Tara Niemann, outfielder Kendra Ganzer, infielder Sam Spellman, catcher Carly Patkus, and infielder Emily Steinway all look to compete with the veterans for playing time. "We will once again be very dependent on our returning players, but we will also rely on some key newcomers. We return 10 significant players, but we also have several new recruits who are pitchers, catchers and position players," McKenzie said.

The Aurora University softball team opens its season with a spring trip to Fort Meyers, FL. Coach McKenzie's goal is to get his squad off to a winning start and knows what it takes to do so: "Our recent success has been due to good pitching, good defense and timely hitting." If these things come together, the 2007 Spartans could be very exciting to watch.






#### Mark Walsh Director of Athletics

Mark Walsh was named Director of Athletics in 1998. Previously, Walsh was AU's Head Baseball Coach from 1992-2002 and Assistant Coach from 1987-1992. Walsh led the Spartans to nine NIIC Conference Championships and nine

NCAA Tournament appearances while posting a 320-85 (.790) win-loss record in 10 seasons. Walsh also served as Assistant Football Coach at AU from 1986-1996 and was part of the coaching staff that reinstated football after it had been dropped in 1952. Walsh earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Aurora University.

### This Is Aurora University



Eckhart Hall

Aurora University traces its origins to the 1893 founding of a seminary in the small town of Mendota, IL. Though established initially to prepare graduates for ministry, the institution soon adopted a broader mission and moved to a new campus on the western edge of the nearby community of Aurora. With this change came a different name and a growing enrollment. In 1985, the institution was rechristened Aurora University.

In 1992, the Aurora and George Williams College traditions blended when the two institutions entered into the affiliation agreement that paved the way for a merger eight years later.

Today Aurora University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association to award degrees at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. The institution enrolls approximately 4,000 degree-seeking students a year on its Illinois and Wisconsin campuses.

The Aurora campus offers undergraduate and graduate programs through the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Education and the College of Professional Studies (including the Dunham School of Business, School of Nursing, School of Social Work and School of Health and Physical Education.) The graduate programs offer areas of specialization, leading to master's degrees in business administration, mathematics, recreation administration, teaching and social work, as well as a doctorate in education.

At AU, academic programs are enhanced through learning opportunities. The Dunham Scholars Program incorporates service learning and extracurricular activities into its business curriculum. The Honors Program offers students advanced coursework, innovative seminars and participation in special events. May Term is a three-week program offering opportunities to study abroad, research a science topic on campus or travel to Chicago to explore the city's culture.

AU offers its undergraduates a wide range of on- and off-campus learning experiences. Students participate in more than 60 musical, literary, religious, social and service organizations and play active roles in campus governance. The university also fields 18 NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletic teams. The Spartans boast a winning tradition with 49 conference titles in recent years and 27 regular appearances in national tournaments.

The Alumni Hall of Physical Education features a racquetball court, climbing wall, complete locker room facilities, training room, weight room, aerobic-activities room, classroom and coaches' offices.

Aurora University is located in west Aurora, within an hour's drive of Chicago and at the western end of the Illinois Research and Development Corridor. It is accessible via Interstate 88 at the Orchard Road exit.
