



Using the Course Catalog to Search for Course in Student Planning



STEP 1: After logging into your **Okta dashboard** at aurorauniversity.okta.com, click on the **Self-Service** application.



STEP 2: You will see a **Self-Service dashboard** with commonly used sites. Click on **Course Catalog**.




STEP 3: The catalog can be searched by using a **Subject Search** or an **Advanced Search**.




Using the Course Catalog to Search for Course in Student Planning

STEP 4: The **Catalog Advanced Search** allows you to search for specific courses, limit searches by days/times, and focus on specific locations. Setting the results view to **Section Listing** will show the most information when searching.





Course Description Art and architecture are often used to express power. Those in power, whether individuals or institutions, manipulate images, build and destroy monuments to power and ambition, and sponsor art that reveals values and power relationships. Through detailed study of works of art and architecture related to power or the lack of power, this course explores how expressions of power in art and architecture affect society and historical events and how modern concerns about propaganda, media, and manipulation color our own approach to the art and architecture of the past.
