


Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program



The National Science Foundation Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship program is designed to help address the nationwide shortage of high-quality teachers in science, technology, engineering, and math, particularly among groups underrepresented in STEM fields.

The program, known as Noyce Scholars, is open to select Biology, Chemistry, and Mathematics majors entering their junior year at AU. Noyce Scholars will receive an annual undergraduate scholarship of up to \$18,000 for the last two years of their secondary education program.


