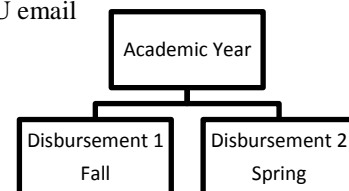
¹ Your financial aid is based on the semester hours, housing plans, and academic program information shown. It is **your responsibility** to notify the Office of Financial Aid if any of these items differ from your award letter.

² Direct costs are those costs billed by the university. If you indicated that you plan to live on campus, the estimated room and board costs are based on a **double-occupancy room and a block meal plan rate**. Actual room and board charges will be determined upon securing a housing assignment and will reflect on your billing statement (e-Bill). Estimated direct costs do not include fees charged for specific courses or academic programs. Your actual charges and payments may be different. Your e-Bill will be posted online by the Student Accounts Office approximately one month before each semester begins. Graduate cohort students should refer to the Tuition/Fees Payment Agreement form for monthly payment plans as the payment schedule may differ.

Please be aware of indirect costs such as books, supplies, transportation, personal expenses, etc. We estimate approximately **\$500 per semester** for books.

³ Your loan disbursement dates have been predetermined by the university. Students enrolled in a semester or a modular program will have one scheduled loan disbursement each semester of attendance. Summer semester loan disbursements are based on summer course dates. Your loan disclosure statement from the U.S. Department of Education will indicate your anticipated disbursement dates and amounts. You will be notified by the Student Accounts Office via your AU email account upon the arrival of your loan disbursement(s).

Please note: Previously students in a modular program received multiple loan disbursements within a semester. Starting with the 2016-2017 academic year, **all students** receive one loan disbursement per semester. Please reference the chart for the disbursement schedule.



⁴ The total loan funds applied to your student account will be **less** than the total amount you accept. The amount accepted is the loan principal that you will be required to repay. However, a loan origination fee of no more than 3% is deducted from each Direct Stafford Loan disbursement by the U.S. Department of Education before the funds are applied to your bill. If accepting the Direct Parent PLUS Loan or Direct Graduate PLUS Loan, a loan origination fee is deducted from each disbursement with the current loan origination fee at 4.276%. These fees are subject to change based on federal regulations.

Please take these fees into consideration when evaluating the loan amount(s) you wish to accept. **Watch for your loan disclosure statement from the U.S. Department of Education**, which provides the loan origination fee information.

⁵ Aurora University is committed to offering meaningful work opportunities for all students. On-campus jobs are in high demand. The amount listed as FWS is the annual amount you are eligible to earn, if hired. Earnings will not automatically be deducted from your charges. If you are not FWS eligible, you still have the option to pursue on-campus employment. Student workers are paid bi-weekly following the current minimum wage guidelines for a maximum of 15 hours per week. Your aid is contingent upon the availability of funds and the verification process, if you are selected. The Office of Financial Aid reviews your FAFSA information, your enrollment status, and your Satisfactory Academic Progress to determine eligibility. Completed financial aid funds will be applied to a student's account after the first week of the semester.
