

FINANCIAL AID FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS STARTING **SUMMER 2021**

Step 1: Submit Summer Aid Application

Summer Aid Applications are available beginning in December (S1 at aurora.edu/forms2020).

Step 2: File/Update FAFSAs

The 20-21 FAFSA is used for the summer semester, whereas the 21-22 FAFSA is used for the upcoming Fall 2021 and Spring 2022 semesters.

You may file the 21-22 FAFSA beginning October 1, 2020.

If you have already filed the 20-21 FAFSA as an undergraduate student, update the questions listed below and submit the updated FAFSA on April 1, 2021.

FAFSA Section	FAFSA Question	FAFSA Answer
Student Demographics	What will your grade level be when you begin the 2020-2021 school year?	1 st year graduate/professional
Student Demographics	What degree or certificate will you be working on when you begin the 2020-2021 school year?	Graduate or professional degree
Dependency Status	At the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year, will you be working on a master's or doctorate program (such as an MA, MBA, MD, JD, PhD, EdD, graduate certificate, etc.)?	Yes

Step 3: Complete Required Paperwork

Check WebAdvisor to view your award letters, when notified via AU email. Submit requested items listed in "My Documents" to the Office of Financial Aid. Make sure to complete requests for both summer and 21-22 aid.

Financial Aid Eligibility

- No grants available
- Annual Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan Limit is \$20,500
 - If you borrowed \$7,500 as an undergraduate student during the fall and spring semesters, you could have up to \$13,000 left for the following summer semester (\$20,500 - \$7,500 = \$13,000) depending on your Cost of Attendance
- If additional aid is needed, you can apply for the Graduate PLUS Loan, which is based on credit, at studentaid.gov or inquire with the Office of Financial Aid for other options
